

A systematic approach to **COVID-19 recovery planning** relies on:

- 1. The use of planning **premises** that are based on an analysis of:
 - a. higher education trends here and abroad
 - b. results of scientific research done by reputable institutions
 - c. government mandates pertaining to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- 2. Consideration of the concerns, preferences, and values of **students and stakeholders** internal (i.e., workforce) and external (e.g., employers).
- 3. Pursuit of strategies that **balance** planning premises, stakeholder considerations, and organizational **mission and sustainability**.




COVID-19 Recovery Planning

FIRST PREMISE

There will very likely be successive waves of new cases, which implies multiple peaks of infection and multiple orders of community quarantine similar to the Spanish Flu pandemic of 1918-1919.




SECOND PREMISE

Once schools reopen in SY 2020-2021, there will very likely be a nationwide dip in enrollment by up to 50%-70%. Reasons:

- Financial inability to pay the cost of private education as a result of parents' unemployment during the lockdown period
- Lack of internet access at home or weak internet signals in communities
- Students' and parents' potential discomfort with online education.




Planning Premises


